Eye of the Beholder

So many years have gone by since the Turners Auctions, Yahoo and IAW sales. As we attend conventions and meet stars at various events an opportunity presents itself to get props and wardrobe signed by the actors. Wardrobe pieces that came off the set and from subsequent handling may have become worn, torn or lost stitching and some props may have incurred a variety of damage including chips or cracks. Attempting to fix these issues on our own in an attempt to do good we may just be causing more harm. If a prop incurs damage do we repair it or leave it as is? Are alterations to wardrobe rendering them worthless or are we increasing the value?

As observed by serious prop collectors, not just for Xena props, a general consensus is that any unstable prop in its composition (latex rubber, hard rubber, foam etc.) should be stabilized. I have a rubber Talia dagger and the tip tends to curl up due to the soft material. I have mine in a leather dagger sheath to keep the rubber blade straight with even pressure on either side. It is always recommended to protect props from dust in display cases with ventilation and from excessive light. Restoration on any prop should be considered on an individual case basis and severe damage that rendered a prop worthless will stay worthless without restoration. At least in that particular case if you fix a severely damaged prop you can enjoy the beauty of it after it is restored even if it is not sellable or the value is now way under what was paid for it. A prop with any reasonable chip, crack or broken pieces I would leave alone as the set wear is what gives the piece its appeal. There have been instances in the past where 'collectors' have taken well-worn wardrobe or props that have been mildly damaged through screen use and renovated them to pristine condition, this is unacceptable. I have conversed with collectors that feel having an original piece signed totally renders the prop worthless and they would not touch it. This is where we deem the value to be in the "Eye of the Beholder", as there are 2 sides to this issue. I will interject my personal feeling here but would like to get feedback from readers on this subject. Your thoughts will truly help set the course for my actions in the future, possibly others as well.

Signed items

I myself have had a wardrobe piece signed on the inside of the garment so it would not be visible when displayed on a mannequin but easily accessible by folding back the material. I think this is fine if the signature does not detract from the beauty and workmanship of the costume piece as it hangs on a mannequin or in a closet. The one disaster that comes to mind is if it is a lightweight or silk material and the signature done on the inside bleeds through to the outside. I would evaluate this possibility before having wardrobe signed. I personally approve of having wardrobe signed on the *inside* of the garment, gauntlet, boot, etc. but do not like obvious blatant signatures on props I think it takes away from the beauty of it. If you must have a prop signed and forever altered then I would be careful that you are sure that the actor signing most likely handled that *type* prop (unless your prop is a one-off or was screen matched) or that the actor was an important catalyst regarding the item. It would seem reckless to me to have an actor sign a wardrobe piece or prop that had nothing to do with their character or was not seen used by them but just used perhaps in an episode they were in. Remember there may be collectors who will not touch a signed piece so always keep this in mind unless you never plan to sell it.

Repairing Wardrobe

If a wardrobe piece has a tear in a place that is very noticeable or the weight of the garment on a hanger is causing the tear to become bigger there are very subtle and temporary repairs that can be applied. For instance a seamstress tape can be attached to the fabric on the inside to hold the ends together minimizing the tear to just a straight line and reinforcing the material. This tape has a mild adhesive and can temporarily restore the piece as close as possible to the original condition but can also be removed if needed without causing any traces or permanent damage. I have seen pins used to attach tags to wardrobe and I would just leave those alone, but I would not use any additional pins, these holes can become larger over time. I made this mistake a while back pinning the ends together on a robe so it would stay closed. I have since wised up and used small clips to attach material together for robes or shirts to stay closed on a mannequin unless there is a pin from the set already in place. Any cracked leather or obvious “wear” should be left alone. Be very careful and never assume anything when having props sent to a frame or collectibles shop to have them set up for display. Make sure you understand what they are going to do and if it will altar the prop in any way. I have heard where a garment was glued down to a felt board in a display case so it could hang on the wall that rendered the prop worthless; this is an obvious tragic mistake!

Using Props in Projects

I have had small wardrobe and prop pieces incorporated into lovely books and this does altar the prop from the original state. Small fabric pieces or any small item that is not likely to ever match up with another prop in a significant way tends to sit in the bottom of boxes. I feel if that item can be enjoyed as part of a project then it very well may be the thing to do as it now has an element of meaning and significance. However, I would say that if you do this, again, the prop will be changed forever being cut down or applied with adhesive and requires some thought about what goals you are trying to accomplish when doing this. I had a green dragon silk flag or sash (we were never sure which) incorporated expertly into an autograph book. The goal here was to have actor Daniel Sing sign next to the piece at the 2008 Xena Con as he was the “Green Dragon” and I felt this was a significant enough purpose.

I also had scroll paper fragments that were very unstable and on the road to deteriorating so I felt incorporating them in a book they would be better preserved.

Is changing a prop a huge irresponsible action or does it have its place? I am very interested how you feel about altering props and wardrobe and would love to receive your comments! I will post **every** response I receive in the February issue.

Having watched the It's A Wrap-Yahoo auctions obsessively, Mark recalls seeing the Prince Hercules cossie selling, minus the boots. It wasn't until the It's A Wrap warehouse sale (post auctions) that he found the boots in a big container of various boots/shoes. The boots were mostly shipped in separate containers, which may explain why many cossies were sold without their respective footwear.

The boots are practically mint, so Patrick must not have had much action in that episode. The two boots are tied together and the studio tag reads "Prince Herc" and labels inside both boots have Patrick Kake's name. Watching the episode you'll see these are definitely the boots for the costume, they are black leather and lace up the sides rather than the front.

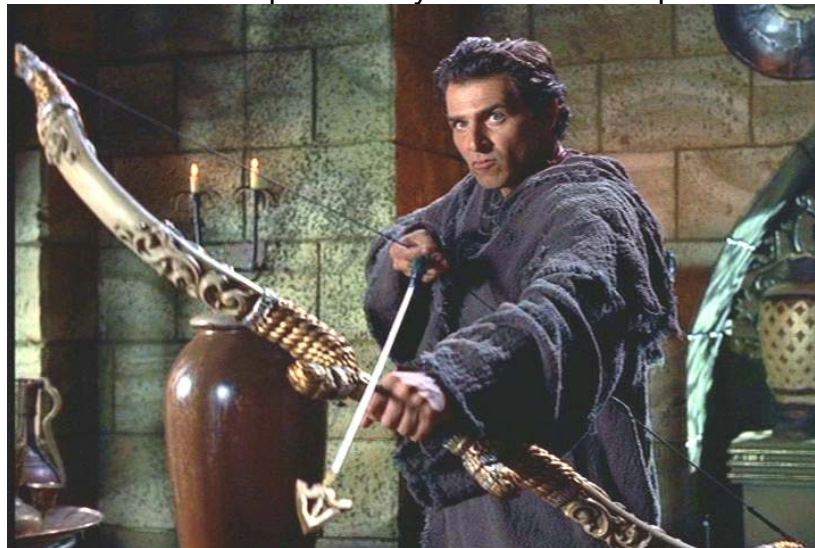

Q 1 I was wondering how do you respond to people who do not understand why you would want to collect prop and wardrobe items? I am asking because although my friends are supportive of my hobbies one of them recently said that it was "embarrassing" to have people come over to the house because I had my props and wardrobe in display cases where they could "be seen." She said a collection is one thing but displaying them makes it seem like I was creating some sort of "shrine to an old TV show." Wow, I didn't really know how to respond to that especially since my collection is limited to my office where nobody else needs to go and does not spread to the rest of the shared household. I just said that I would never make that comment about anyone's collection if that collection meant something to them personally. People collect ALL sorts of items-stamps, coins, pins, animal figurines, model cars, etc. Do other people feel this way? Just curious because I don't really feel a need to defend my collection, but it seems like other people think I somehow need to come up with a good reason. **MORGAN**

A 1 I bet that if you asked your friend and dug deep enough, there would be something SHE likes that SHE thinks is embarrassing and I think her comment mostly reveals that she is overly concerned about what other people think of HER! People have all kinds of different hobbies and there are many things that other people love and collect that I will never understand. I love my Xena props. And I know others do not "get" that so I am not judgmental about what other people collect (even if I don't understand it!). As far as whether or not you display your collection, that is completely your choice and no one else's. Personally, I do not have my collection on display; I have it carefully stored but I do regularly take things out and appreciate them (it's like opening them for the first time all over again). And yes, part of the reasoning as to why I don't have my collection on display is that it is something I enjoy and I just want to enjoy it without having to defend it or explain it. And my partner does not "get" Xena, so we have basically

agreed that everyone just has their own thing they are interested in and we leave it at that. And if she wants something that I don't "get", I don't question it. I figure that once people know me well, and they find out that I love this stuff, they will just see it as part of my personality (just as, if you have a friend that collects coins, etc., that's just their thing and you just take for granted that it's part of who that person is and what they like). If your collection inspires you and connects you to something that made a huge impact on many people, then you should keep it and display it as you wish. For goodness sake; people sometimes feel religious affinity towards a piece of toast that burned in the shape of Jesus! But if that inspires them to live better lives, who cares? And I completely, completely agree with Barbie....it's RARITY, not age that makes something valuable. Those of us who collect props own some very rare items. I think they are even more valuable because some props are delicate (costumes, etc.) and unless they are cared for properly by people like us, they will break, disintegrate, etc. I'm so glad that they are not being lost. I hope you will always be proud of your collection and you can wonder why your friend's insecurity led her to make such a comment. I know there are people who will not understand the lengths we go to obtain these items (both in time invested tracking things down, making connections with sellers, etc. and the lengths we go to financially) but that's why this newsletter is great....there ARE people who understand! **Tedra**

Q 2 Do you have a prop/wardrobe piece or collection that you sold or traded that you wish now you had not parted with? **JENNY**

A 2 Have had many items go over the desk of Kimbasarchives over the years. Most notably the headdress of Xena's from the Debt- The Destroyer of Nations. If I had my druthers I would redo time and not have not sold that one. I was lucky back in 2001 when IAW called on me to ID a bunch of Xena stuff to find that piece. It was thrown in a box of costumes and I recognized the fabric on the top of the headdress. You couldn't even see the leather and the studs- let alone the intricate coins! It was so crammed in with a bunch of boots and other costumes from Herc, Xena and Jack of All Trades and Cleo 2525. When I fished it out and saw what it was- I was thrilled! Do I wish I had it back? Oh yeah. But it went to a dear friend of mine, and it couldn't have gone to a better place- The Xena Museum. I did get the crown of my collection though and that was Lucy's Hero leathers. So in many ways you have to look at it as, how many costumes do you need hanging in your closet and what can they do for you as an asset? If I recall I sold the headdress, the gauntlets (her Debt ones as well) and the Saba costume and helmet (another one I'd rather have back) but I do have a very nice pool in my back yard so you have to decide what is going to work for you. You know? Some times a collection can be a hobby turned investment turned profit, but many times if you wish to collect- plan on losing money because especially now, it is a buyers market! Hope this helps with your question Jenny.

A 2 Years ago I obtained a prop book used on Hercules and I re-sold it once I realized it was a Hercules prop since I only collect Xena items. Well, just last year I found a prop collector who was SPECIFICALLY looking for that book and I regretted selling it when I did as I would have loved to have sold it to someone who wanted that exact prop. I had and sold a resin scythe weapon used by Xena as Kali in the "The Way" (at least it was the exact same type used by Xena in this episode), and I later obtained some other items from "The Way" and wished I still had that scythe to go with them! Lastly, I sold a very early Lucy piece; her Amazon armor top from her role as Lysia in Hercules and the Amazon women....I have had misgivings about letting go of something so early and so rare. But I have to remember that I sold those items in order to afford what I have now. And I would not part with anything I bought as a result of selling those items. **TEDRA**

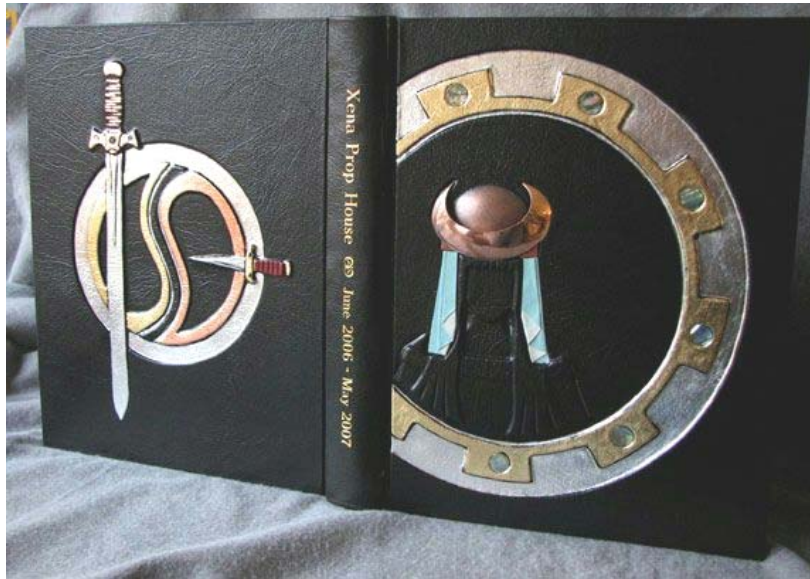

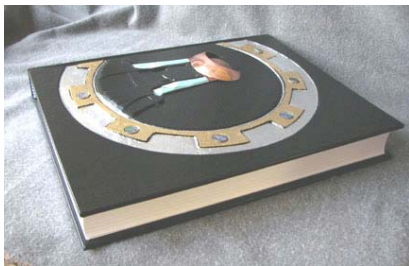

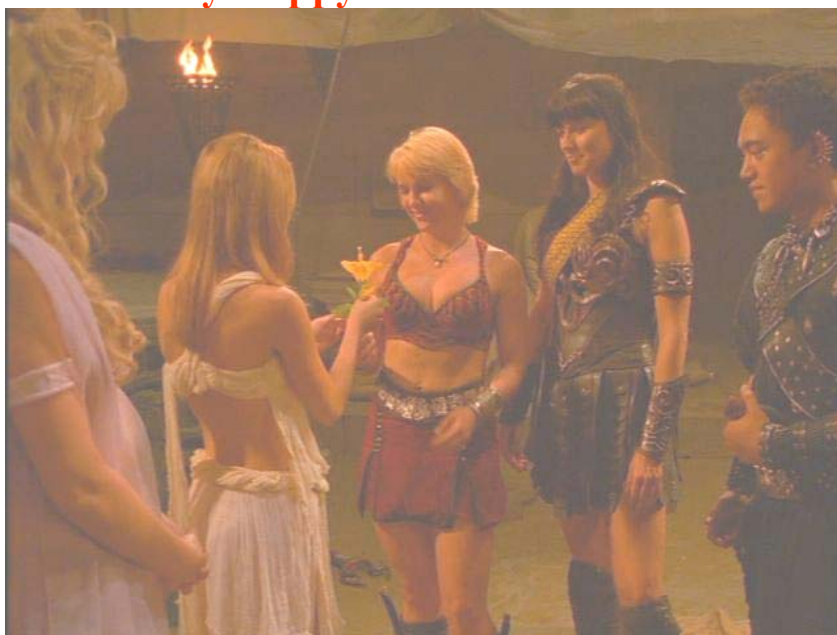
